Immediately after the Convocation a light reception will be held at the Gilbert School and there will be an opportunity to preview the Museum from 3:15 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Remarkably, the American Museum of Tort Law is the first and only law museum of any kind in the United States! The Museum will be an important cultural and educational forum about tort law and pertinent activities throughout the country. It will focus on the rich historical legacy of the civil justice system in American life, to inform people about the effect on their lives of Tort Law, which deals with wrongful injuries, and to explain the benefits and challenges to civil juries and the civil justice system in our country.

Among invited guests will be our Founders who had the vision to help make this museum a reality; and judges, leading trial attorneys; former plaintiffs; former jurors; federal, state, and local officials, law school deans, friends and associates. Because of the unique status of this museum, and the importance of its subject, we expect significant national, regional and local media coverage.
